The Virtual Colonoscopy is a screening test. It may also be performed when a traditional colonoscopy cannot be. In general, screening tests are performed with the assumption that the patient will NOT have any abnormality; the purpose of this test is to confirm that the patient is "disease free". However, if an abnormality (polyp) is found, a traditional colonoscopy (performed by a gastroenterologist) or other procedure may have to be performed in order to confirm the findings and surgically remove any polyps.
